What St Loye's did last year

The Residential Training Programme Financed by the DWP

- Helped 255 disabled people to plan for an independent future
- Arranged training courses for 169 of these people
- Guided 66 trainees into jobs
- Awarded 42 NVQ or similar qualifications
- Reduced our drop-out rate by almost half (2008-9 vs 2007-8)

Devon Works

A project supported by DWP and the European Social Fund.

Launched in July 2008 Devon works aims to improve the employability and skills of unemployed and inactive people in certain priority areas across the county.

- Established links with community providers from the public, private and voluntary sectors
- Advised 211 unemployed and disadvantaged people on training and job opportunities
- Helped our partner, Shaw Trust, to place 31 people into work



Blue Badges Delivered for Devon County Council

Issued 15,989 Blue Badges to people with limited mobility.

Changing People's lives

Paul was interested in becoming an Electrician, but since becoming unemployed he could not afford the training. His DEA put him in touch with St Loye's Foundation who were able to organise and fund his course at PGL Training, a specialist provider of training for the construction industry.

Paul achieved a City and Guilds level 3 qualification in Requirements for Electrical Instillation and an EAL Certificate of Domestic Electrical Instillation, Intermediate Level. Paul now works for the franchise Mr Electric and is in charge of covering the Devon area.

Paul said: "I have wanted to train as an electrician for a long time but without St Loye's' help, I would not have been able to do this course".
